Scripture Union (SU) of Malawi has secured a twoyear scholarship from Presbyterian Church in Ireland (PCI) through Council for Global Mission towards a study of Master in Organisational Leadership at Africa International University in Kenya for Goodson Saulos, Division Coordinator for Southern Malawi.

According to Amon Chanika, National Director for SU Malawi, this is a Global Leaders in Training (LIT) grant worth $\pm 3,628$ per year and Saulos is expected to start his studies in May 2023. But how will this individual support benefit SU as an organization?

"This grant is going to a senior staff. SU needs a lot of Organisational Leadership training to ensure health and smooth leadership transition in future," explained Chanika.

Saulos is so excited to be part of this training and is all thankful to PCI.

URBAN RALLY YIELDS 900 LIVES FOR CHRIST

Scripture Union (SU) of Malawi organised an urban rally for Bible clubs within Lilongwe where 1,200 learners from 40 schools attended and 900 gave their lives to Christ.

The arrangement enables children to interact through activities such as singing, games, and dramas. Above all, the Word of God is shared.

"We have seen that children love competition and when they see their friends performing, they acquire some skills and improve their performances. This then helps them perform better during Scripture memory competitions," said Amon Chanika, National Director for SU Malawi.

Chanika quickly points out that the main purpose for such gatherings is to share the Word of God and for the children to fellowship. He also highlighted that SU Malawi has in place proper follow-up procedures.

"We work with teachers who closely interact with the learners at Bible clubs. 65 teachers from all the 40 schools that attended the rally were also in attendance and these are the ones we depend on to follow up on learners who commit their lives to Christ," concluded Chanika.

Scripture Union (SU) of Malawi held a Nkhongono Zako Zenecho consultative seminar on 30 March 2023 at Simama Hotel in Lilongwe with some Ministers and Church Leaders of CCAP, Synod of Livingstonia. The purpose of the Seminar was to discuss how 'Nkhongono Zako Zenecho,' a Tumbuka devotional book, can be effectively used in churches.

"The meeting was attended by 22 leaders. We thank God for the financial support from Presbyterian Church in Ireland (PCI)," said Amon Chanika, National Director for SU Malawi.

In reaction to the seminar, Reverend Dr Mwawi Chilongozi of Thanthwe CCAP, who is also the General Secretary of CCAP General Assembly said "it had come at a right time to encourage Christians to be grounded in the Word of God in the middle of challenging times. Being grounded in the Word of God will help us respond to such challenges based on the Word of God," she said.

Another participant, Reverend J. Nyirongo of Kanengo CCAP said that having the devotional notes in vernacular language is a great initiative.

"People are proud of their local languages and this will make communication with Tumbukas so easy and simple," he said.

"Apart from the local language, this seminar has addressed my life. When you are impacted first as a leader, it is easy to impact on others," he added.

Finally, Reverend Chawinga of Lumbadzi CCAP ST Mark congregation said that he was challenged to study the Word of God even more as a pastor.

"Pastors are people who need to study the Bible daily because once they stop, then they stop having content to share with their followers," he concluded.
