#### Ministry Highlight

Our annual camps were held in all divisions from July 28th-July 31st. These camps bring together children from various primary school bible clubs and churches for discipleship and connection with each other. This year 200 children attended in the Eastern Region, 270 children in the Southern Division, 397 children in the central division and 219 in the Northern Division.

The camps were fun and interactive with activities such as talent display, recreational games and career guidance talks. We were also excited to see children participating and taking lead in bible study and prayer sessions. And sharing their bible club experiences with each other.



#### Ministry Partnerships

World Vision Malawi donated 350 NIV Study bibles to Scripture Union Malawi. There is an on-going distribution of the bibles to bible club leaders. This has started with Lilongwe urban zone bible clubs.

56 bible clubs were established in Lilongwe rural in partnership with Peanut Butter plus Jesus Ministry (PB+J)

We partnered with Living Seed in the Eastern Region, for youth discipleship training at the Hangers Youth Center-Liwonde

# Stories of impact: this month's story is about how a Bible Club Camp Changed the Life of 'John' a Former Street Youth.

John was once a bible club member and had attended our central division camps regulary. However, for the last three years John failed to attend camp. After losing his mother he found himself in the streets, homeless and struggling to get by.

John dropped out of school and lived in the streets begging for money from sex workers. This year John heard from a Scripture Union youth community bible study member about the Bible camp. Although he did not have any money for registration, John was determined to attend the camp. On the day of departure, John made his way at the church were all children and volunteers were meeting to leave for the camp. He got on the bus, without any payment for registration and went to the camp.

Upon arrival John narrated his story to our camp coordinator. With the help of Thomas Jessale, John recommitted his life to Jesus Christ.

At his rock bottom he recalled how the camps had helped him in his spiritual growth. In his desperation for a connection with God, John was determined to attend the Bible Club Camp.

A week now after the camps have ended, John has been connected with our central zone coordinator who lives close to him (Mchesi) for counselling and discipleship.

John's story is a reminder on how these camps have become a place of hope for many children. By creating an environment for connection, spiritual growth and discipleship, we can transform our communities.

Let's continue to support Scripture Union Malawi as God uses us as servants in his kingdom.
